# Objectives:

- -Identify major causes of anemia in developing countries.
- -Discuss treatment options for anemia.
- -Identify major viral diseases found in developing countries.
- -Describe diagnostic and treatment modalities available in resource-poor environments.
- -Identify current methods for diagnosis and treatment of malaria including options for prophylaxis.
- -List a differential diagnosis for common presenting symptoms in the tropics.
- -Discuss the reduction of rabies risk through proper initial wound management and vaccination.
- -List the advantages of pre-exposure rabies vaccination.
- -Discuss proper post-exposure management of a bite at high risk for rabies.
- -Discuss rabies prevention strategies in the U.S. vs the developing world.
- -Review options for bush lab and clinical lab development.
- -Demonstrate ability to prepare tissue for basic tests including urine dipstick and microscopy, peripheral blood smear, stool smear, hematocrit, and point-of-care test for HIV, hepatitis A&B, and Rapid Test for Malaria.
- -Discuss the methods of diagnosis and treatment using the algorithm presented in the textbook.
- -Demonstrate ability to utilize diagnostic and treatment information in the textbook by solving required case studies.
- -Identify oral health issues that may lead to systemic diseases in developing countries.
- -Observe how to extract teeth.
- -Demonstrate skill utilizing ART and Sliver Diamond Fluoride techniques.
- -Identify the most common skin diseases in the developing world.
- -Discuss diagnosis and treatment options for the most common skin diseases in the developing world.
- -Describe potential problems with international drug availability and efficacy.
- -Discuss WHO Guidelines for dispensing and prescribing drugs.
- -Describe the multifaceted problems associated with decreased access to safe quality drinking water, low levels of sanitation, and poor hygiene.
- -Discuss possible low-tech and low-cost solutions for quality drinking water, low levels of sanitation and poor hygiene in developing countries.

- -Discuss various pitfalls of short-term medical missions.
- -Identify best practices that emphasize international partnerships and sustainability.
- -State symptoms and treatment of tuberculosis.
- -Discuss the local and national health care system issues in resource poor countries that contribute to the ongoing high maternal and perinatal morality.
- -Describe complications common to treating tuberculosis in developing countries.
- -Identify the common sexually transmitted infections (STIs), including syphilis.
- -Discuss the concept of Syndromic Management of STIs in low resource environments.
