Why did you choose Equip as your sending agency?

I felt a strong connection with the vision and mission of Equip after attending a MMI course in 2018. One year later, when I was searching and praying about joining a sending organization, Equip was the first one on my heart and mind to reach out to.

The holistic mission to disciple the nations and help communities to be transformed in Christ is a huge passion I share with Equip, and I am grateful for their support and coming alongside me on this journey serving among the nations!

What is the purpose of Sustaining Love KIDS, your ministry in Ghana?

Our purpose is to provide a safe and loving learning environment for vulnerable children and youth and to give support to families through building a bridge of love to the gospel.

I strongly believe that the Lord can use the platform of education as a means to grow and nurture the mind of a child, equipping them to read God's Word, which is alive and active, so they can discover for themselves the plans God has for them. The ability to read and write can also open a whole new world of opportunities for children who come from vulnerable and hopeless backgrounds due to extreme poverty.

Why did you choose Equip as your sending agency?

We felt for the first time we found an organization that was happy to come alongside God's calling on our family and to honor what we were already doing for the Kingdom. We deeply appreciated (and still do!) all the ways that they have empowered missionaries like us to pursue our ministry.

Can you give us an update on your literacy program?

God has given us the privilege to help lay the groundwork for a gospel-based literacy program that is now being distributed and taught to 1,000 Quechua children who are learning to read while at the same time learning about the gospel for the first time.

Working with ministry partners, we created, published, and printed materials for children in their native language Quechua. Three little girls have already accepted Christ and are enthusiastically drawing their family to church gatherings.

It has been such a joy to work hand-in-hand with Equip International on Stage 2 of the Global Action Plan to Boost Recovery in South America.

CHARLES CHERUIYOT

How does your ministry integrate farming and faith?

Over many years peasant farmers in Africa have been struggling to produce food and have a quality life. Training on how to do proper farming the way God intended has been lacking. The way we are helping now is done by equipping farmers through various knowledge and skills that will make them realize their potential through farming and feed the nation by applying simple methods as directed by God since the creation of the universe. This approach will make them self-sufficient and have enough food and money to educate their children and support God's work through the church.

How has the ministry expanded recently?

The farming training has seen many farmers benefiting from the Farming God's Way program, and we have intensified the training in many villages across various communities. The preparation for planting in western Kenya is on course, and we are doing everything possible to train more farmers as a way to fight hunger and poverty. The program did well this year and we hope to continue this year to cover more areas if we get support again.

Has the drought over the last year impacted your community?

May God bless our people in northern Kenya who are currently facing severe drought and famine due to failure of the rain the whole of last year. We benefited from training and farm input support from Equip and are grateful that the yield will be good despite not getting sufficient rain during the growing season. These communities now know that farming the way God intended is going to bring glory to God and make human beings happy.

JIM & DIANA FRANTZ COLOMBIA

How did your work with Investing Hope Foundation begin?

Over five years ago, we began forming Savings Groups in poor communities in and around Bogota. God brought together a group of supporters who helped finance the start-up of Investing Hope Foundation (IHF). IHF promotes community economic development through savings and entrepreneurship groups and biblically-based financial training in Bogota. Over the last five years, Investing Hope Foundation has grown to serve over 1,100 adults and 3,600 children and youth. Last year, in a pandemic, our participants saved over \$91,000 USD.

Who do you partner with to carry out this work?

IHF joins and strengthens the ministry of Christian organizations and schools that disciple children and secular schools or organizations working with kids. As we entered a new semester with lower pandemic numbers, new groups joined with in-person meetings and implemented the experiential model with savings. We had been working with mainly community groups and started eight more groups and 49 new groups in schools.

What is the goal of the program?

We help children understand important principles, the most important being there is a God who loves them and desires to give them hope and a future. Our goal is to show the hope and love of God to each child and adult who joins the program and to plant the seed of knowing who God is in their lives.
